Songwriter Circle comes to the June 11th Coffeehouse, in memory of Greg Shrader

It's hard to believe that over three years have slipped away since Greg Shrader passed from this existence. But in what has evolved into an annual event, this month's coffee house will have Greg's touch. A long time ago, he suggested the idea of a songwriter's workshop. Greg wrote a lot of choice songs and was quite knowledgeable about the craft musically, lyrically, spiritually, and any other way you can think of. His original vision was to do the workshop as a session by and for songwriters, possibly as a sidelight to the Delmarva Folk Festival. It wasn't too much of a challenge to convince him that others would be interested too, so the idea of a songwriters coffee house was born.

For the few months before his passing, Greg and I had been working on the idea. He was committed to doing it in June of 2002 and had it pretty well cultivated in his head as far as format and who else he wanted on stage with him. I never got the chance to get the whole picture, and I'm only aware of a few good friends he wanted there, but know he had others in mind.

After Greg left us, it was decided to go ahead and try to make it work. If nothing else, it would be as good a tribute to Greg as there could be. We've pulled it off three times now, and it seems fitting to try to do it every June, just because.

Deloy Moore was one of Greg's picks and he'll be leading things again this year. Deloy has written enough songs to fill several thick notebooks (I've seen them). He writes about life from a lot of different angles and in different styles and will of course have a Greg song or two to dispense. Deloy has brought back one friend from last year, and has recruited five newcomers, including his daughter, to explore the fine art of songwriting.

Last year's veteran, Tad Jones, may be better-known to FoF members as the sound man at our Delmarva Folk Festival. Along with that considerable talent, he's also a multi-instrumentalist and songwriter, but he has only recently begun sharing this hidden side with us. He's composed some thoughtful, introspective songs about love, life, and all the twists and turns we encounter on our path. Tad was born near Nashville but came to Delaware as a youngster. He owns Root Cellar Studios in Dover, where he has recorded a number of artists. Tad recorded two of his songs in Nashville and will play one of them at the circle and several new ones. He has played with Greg Ellingsworth as Tad and Greg and is currently performing with Deloy and Mike Hastings as Tangled Roots and The Waterbillies.

We will welcome five newcomers this year, in the persons of Larissa Moore, Greg Ellingsworth, Nik Everett, Michael Miller, and Rodney Collins. **Larissa Moore**, singer/songwriter daughter of Deloy, is no stranger to Friends of Folk. She has been performing at our coffee house for years, and has begun writing some of her own music. Now 18, her strong voice and skilled guitar and bass playing has lately led her to play and sing for a working band called Jack and the Skeletons. Deloy and Larissa plan to do a Greg song together.

A different Greg, singer-songwriter **Greg Ellingsworth**, was born and raised in Milford, Delaware. He grew up listening to country music, Elvis, and the old R&B artist like Fats Domino and Little Richard. Greg began to learn to play guitar at age 14 and started playing in rock and roll bands when his interest was sparked by the Beatles and Stones. Over the years he has sung and played in a variety of bands and venues and his love for music (and the chance to play it--for money or for free) has had him performing with rock & roll club bands, country bands, church praise groups, even (Lord forgive him) disco! He got over that, and in recent years has been performing with Tad Jones as an acoustic duo or adding Deloy as a trio. Sometimes they add additional musicians in the mix for a full band sound or then again sometimes Greg performs totally solo.

Nik Everett, Delaware based musician, composer and performer has been lighting up stages since forming his first junior high school band. Experience was his best teacher so his unique mixture of energy and excitement with finesse and style that comes with musical maturity is evident from the first note of his new release, "SUMMER'S GONE". To **Michael Miller**, art is about expression. Specific styles, genres, or techniques are less important than getting a message across. And his messages are direct and sometimes challenging. "As a cultural historian, I've noticed that a great deal of American popular music is very narrow in its content, no matter how well executed. Relatively few songs reach beyond the conventional modes of love desired, love gained, or love lost. There seems to me to be a lot more in the world to explore and express. So a lot of the lyrics I write push well beyond the mainstream comfort zone. The intention is to be honest about the human experience. If the emperor's not wearing any clothes, I don't mind saying so. What the audience might make of it is up to them, yet I hope to encourage people to engage their minds and their souls with the realities around them." He has lived in Delaware about nine years, and works as the Delaware Folklife Program Manager for the Delaware Division of Parks and Recreation.

Rodney Collins is a member of the local band Nil. They have been at our coffee house before, but it's been a couple of years. Most of the songs are up-tempo and deal with the various views of reality we all experience as we do this thing called life.

The plan is for these artists to take turns explaining something about how they write, what inspires them, what makes a good song. Then they'll play one of their songs, maybe solo, maybe with help. Kind of a song swap, but with an audience. So we're gonna do the best we can, and leave it to Greg's spirit to guide us the rest of the way.

As with past years' efforts there's no way to predict how this will come out; it's an experiment from start to finish. And remember--it's not FOR Greg, it's BY Greg.

It all starts at 7:30 pm, Saturday, June 11, in The Underground on the Wesley College campus in Dover. Admission for this special coffee house is only \$5 for members and \$7 for non-members. Lots of Zeke's fresh coffee, sweet treats and cool drinks will be there, and we hope you'll be there too.

Delmarva Folk Festival Line-Up Announced

Delaware Friends of Folk are pleased to announce most of the performers at the **2005 Delmarva Folk Festival**. The Festival will be on October 1, begins at 11 am, and will be held at the usual place on Downs Chapel Road near Hartly. We are pleased to welcome four acts new to the Festival stage and a bunch of musicians from previous years. Performance times were not set when this was written.

Headlining the Festival this year will be **Full Frontal Folk**. The Frontals played our coffee house last year and over Memorial Day weekend were the anchors for our hugely successful fundraiser Mini-Festival at Cooldog. They never fail to entertain the crowd and are always full of surprises, no matter how many times you see them.

Others new to our Festival include New England bluesman **Andy Cohen**, who has been studying and performing acoustic blues for decades. He has learned a lot about Rev. Gary Davis and will not only do a set on the Festival stage, but will also conduct a guitar-players workshop.

Sam Shaber is the daughter of late-screenwriter David Shaber (Warriors, Nighthawks) and artist Alice Shaber, Sam uses her observer's eye in songs like "Bare," about the crowded nature of being on the road, and "Simon Says," about the importance of personal responsibility in the wake of September 11. Her most recent album is a collaboration with Shawn Mullins.

The other newbie is Delawarean **John Flynn**. Ticket Magazine places John Flynn "at the near end of a long line of American poets, thinkers and folk artists, stretching from Henry David Thoreau, Ralph Waldo Emerson and Walt Whitman, all the way up to Kris Kristofferson". Kristofferson himself praises John's songwriting: "The truth is in the details; the gifts are an ear for accurate dialogue, an eye for powerful imagery and anything funny, and a heart open to surprises and the possibilities of moving the emotions."

We have some folks returning after a year or more off. This includes the bluegrass/newgrass/shoegrass of **3/4 Ton Band**. Despite some personnel changes, these guys will still deliver the toe-tapping rhythms we all love. And coming in from Ohio will be John & Vickie LeCroy. Many of you know John as the former President for Life of Friends of Folk. They've been away far too long and we're glad they've agreed to entertain us again this year.

Only two acts were asked to encore last year's performances, including the **Philadelphia Jug Band** with their honest takes of honest music from a more honest time. They had a great time and so did we, so they're coming back. And **Bruce Anthony** returns after a well-received performance last year. His jazz guitar stylings and imaginative vocals find a perfect setting on the wooded Festival grounds. Local acts performing this year will include **Leilani Wall**, **Molly Raley**, and a few more to be confirmed. All together, we'll have 11 acts, plus John Flynn will entertain the kids in the afternoon with a show that adults will enjoy too.

We'll announce on-sale dates and other details in the next few months. Save the date-October 1, 2005. It'll be another goodle time.
